

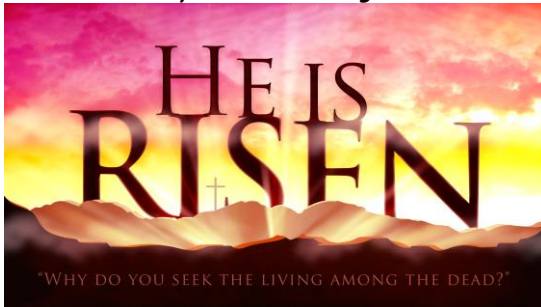

The Rules

1. To most words you just add 's'..... dog /

dogs. 

2. To words ending in **s, sh and ch** you add 'es'.... church / churches

3. To words ending in **f** add 'ves'...

leaf / leaves 

4. Words ending in a **consonant then y** add 'ies'.... Library / libraries

5. To words ending in a **vowel then y**

add 's' key / keys
