Topic—The Suffragettes

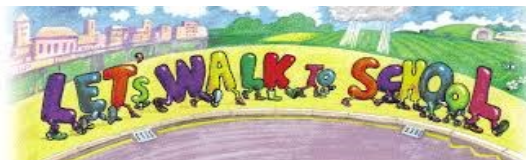
